DESCRIPTION:

The purpose of this scholarship program is to support the children of local working families to participate in training with Tamarack Mountain Sports Education Team (TMSET) athletes.

TMSET operates as a non-profit 501c3.

Families that own businesses and/or work locally are encouraged to apply as are families with multiple children.

The **TMSET LOCAL FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP** will ONLY be awarded in the form of credit toward ski team program fees.

The application may be submitted upon application for the 2016-2017 season

All Scholarships awarded will NOT include a season pass to Tamarack Mountain Resort, but only cover those fees that are specifically related to team training programs either full-time or weekend only. This does not include expenses for camps, races, or travel expenses that may occur from participating in camps and races not scheduled in full-time or weekend only training. Children of persons on the scholarship committee are not eligible for funds.

Awards are athlete and/or family specific. Families must include all athletes on one form.

USSA Code of Conduct to be signed by all Athletes

While participating in any USSA activity:

USSA members shall be subject to the jurisdiction of the International Ski Federation Statutes, the United States Olympic Committee Bylaws, the USSA Bylaws, and the USSA Code of Conduct.

USSA members shall conduct themselves at all times and in all places as befits worthy representatives of the United States of America, the United States Olympic Committee, USSA, their region, division, state or club and in accordance with the best traditions of national and international competition.

USSA members are responsible for knowledge of and adherence to competition rules and procedures. Members are also responsible for knowledge of and adherence to the rules and procedures of the USSA national teams, camps or other projects when participating in such.

USSA members shall maintain high standards of moral and ethical conduct, which includes self-control and responsible behavior, consideration for the physical and emotional well-being of others, and courtesy and good manners.

USSA members shall abide by USSA rules and procedures while traveling to and from and participating in official USSA activities.

USSA members shall abstain from illegal and/or immoderate consumption of alcohol. Absolutely no consumption of alcohol is permitted for those individuals under the age of 21. Members under 21 years of age shall not participate in gatherings involving consumption of alcohol unless it is an official USSA or event organizer function.

No USSA member shall violate the customs, travel or currency regulations of a country while traveling with a USSA group or on a USSA ticket.

No USSA member shall commit a criminal act.

No USSA member shall engage in any conduct that could be perceived as harassment based upon gender, age, race, religion, disability or sexual orientation.

USSA members will avoid profane or abusive language and disruptive behavior.

USSA members agree to abide by anti-doping rules and procedures established by WADA, USADA, and/or FIS.

Failure to comply with any of the above provisions may lead to disciplinary action by the appropriate team or competition leader. Disciplinary action may include:

- Removal from the team trip or training camp.
- Suspension from training and/or competition.
- Elimination of coaching, travel, and other benefits.
- Forfeiture of USSA membership.
